Background

- SEIU Local 99 has announced its intention to hold a three-day strike sometime over the next few weeks
- The dates are expected to be announced this Wednesday, March 15 during a joint UTLA/SEIU rally (March 21, 2023–March 23, 2023)
- Additionally, our labor partner, UTLA, has advised teachers to support the strike by not reporting to work on those three days.
- If this strike does occur, despite our best efforts to avoid it and due to the anticipated lack of both teachers and school staff, it is likely we would have to close schools – without virtual education – until the strike ends.

School-Site Timeline

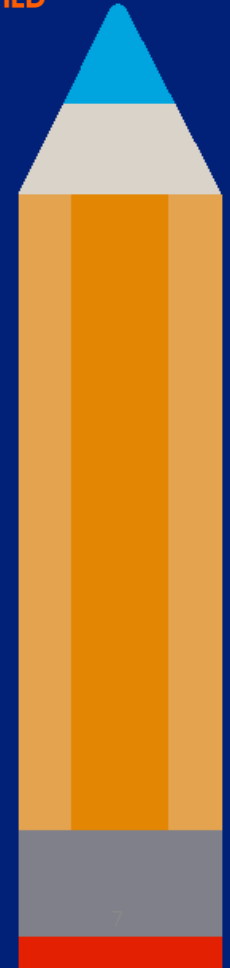
School will:

- Distribute supplies bag to all students
- Share the schedule of virtual office hours
- Ensure that students have technology to take home
- Food service information is pending

During the Strike

- All campuses are closed to students, but will remain open for staff who are reporting on campus
- School staff with support from Region & central personnel will host virtual office hours via Zoom to assist students with asynchronous resources.
- Offices will remain open to address parent questions & concerns, though hours may be modified, based on staffing levels

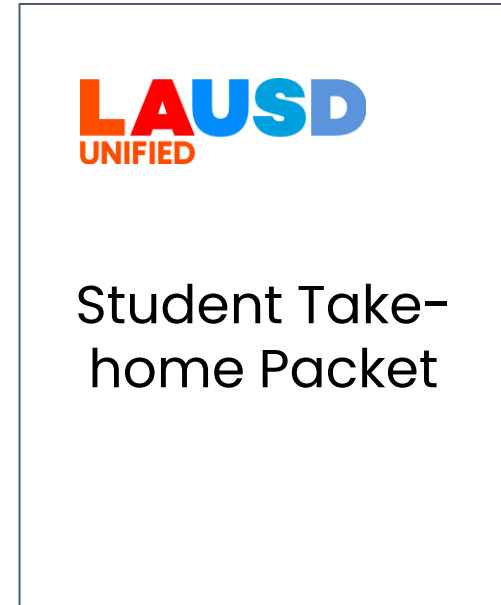

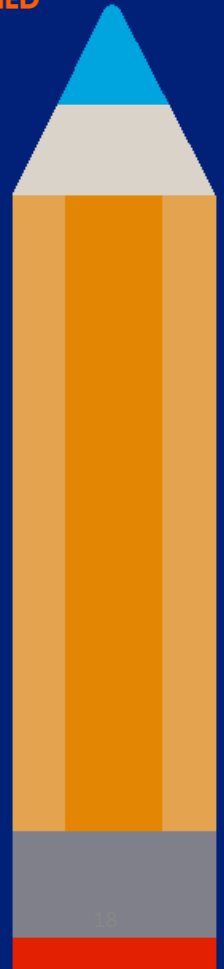

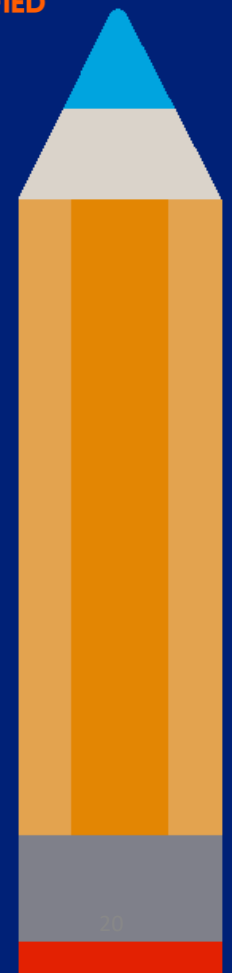

- School staff will ensure that all students have a working device prior to the strike

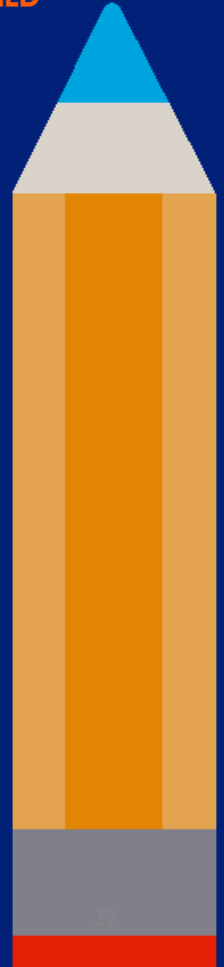
