


Porter Ranch Community School (PRCS) opened in August, 2012. We are a Los Angeles Unified Gold Ribbon and California Distinguished K-8 School located in the hills of Porter Ranch, California. With a student body of 1,200+ students, PRCS is a true community school. The magnitude and depth of support we receive from parents, community leaders, and corporate sponsors is the heart of who we are.

Porter Ranch Community School is a robust, engaging, learning environment where students in kindergarten through 8th grade understand that education is an investment in their own future. They take pride in their academic and leadership accomplishments, display cultural awareness, and empower others to do to the same.

PRCS is a community school that incorporates science, literature, theater, and technology into weekly lessons. Our goal is academic excellence that creates an environment of inclusion and leadership for all of our students, fostering independence and leadership with programs such as Leader in Me in elementary, Restorative Justice and Houses in Middle School. PRCS consistently has the highest test scores in standardized testing of English and Math compared to the neighboring Elementary and Middle Schools in the area. In fact, we are one of the top scoring elementary schools and the top scoring Middle School in our Local District.

Elementary, KDLP, Middle School

We are very fortunate to have an experienced staff of dedicated teachers who are committed to learning the latest teaching methods and standards to ensure student success for all. Our teachers attend yearly trainings across the southland and bring the information, resources and strategies back to the staff. Our faculty consists of 52 credentialed teachers, 12 of which are Nationally Board Certified. We also have over 40 additional support staff, 13 supervision aides, an on- site School Counselor, a School Psychologist and a 5 day full-time Nurse.

Elementary TK - 5

PRCS Elementary offers a Korean Dual Language Two-Way Immersion Program 50/50 model for grades Kindergarten through 5th grade. Elementary program also offers STEAM Enrichments which will include STEM & More, Music, Dance, Theatre, Take Kwon Do, Korean Drums and Computer Wise Lab. See p. 3 for more info by grade level. Afterschool Enrichments and clubs for Elementary include Tennis, Mad Science, Academic Chess, Culinary, Speech and Debate and other wonderful enrichment classes throughout the year. Elementary students can also participate in YMCA aftercare and Kiwanis Club.

Middle School 6th – 8th

PRCS Middle School offers 1 to 1 Chromebooks for every student, Promethean Boards in the classrooms, Accelerated Math courses, variety of Electives including Associated Student Body (ASB), Finance, Marine Science, Scientific Cooking, Yearbook, Creative Writing, Drama and more. We have a Robotics Team and Community Service opportunities as well. Afterschool clubs include homework club and running club and our on-site Youth Services program offers team opportunities throughout the year with a variety of sports.

Parent Community

PRCS is a community of students, parents and teachers that support one another for the benefit of the school. We put high importance on parent involvement with several parent body groups to make this happen. During our inaugural year, our parents established a PTA with its by-laws and committees. We also have The Booster Club, aka the Friends of PRCS, which generates revenue to support many initiatives and programs directly supporting students. And finally, we have the Governing School Council, GSC, which also involves parents who are committed to working with the staff and administration to make PRCS successful.



Benefits of Dual Language Education

Decades of research have shown that students in a dual language program develop academic skills that are on or above par to their peers educated in English-only classrooms.



What is a Dual Language Program? Dual language education is "an effective approach to developing language proficiency and literacy in English and a partner language." Students are instructed in the classroom in both English and a second language.

Did you know that PRCS has a Dual Language Program? From the first day our doors opened in 2012, PRCS has offered one of the 60+ Dual Language Programs across LAUSD with new programs being established every year.

Who is eligible? The benefits of being in a dual language program are irrespective to the language being taught. All students are encouraged to join!

Here at PRCS... PRCS offers a Dual Language Program in Korean. LAUSD selects the language based on a demographic study of the community, of which Korean was the largest language group. As a part of the program, students develop an appreciation for diversity.


Benefits of Becoming/Being Bilingual and Biliterate


Dual Language Education

Goals of Dual Language Program

- Communicative and Academic Second Language Proficiency
- Primary Language Proficiency
- Academic Achievement in both languages
- Appreciation for Diversity
- Develop higher thinking skills and cognitive flexibility
- Increase college choices and job opportunities
- Prepare for our future global society

Cognitive Benefits of DL Education

- Build MULTITASKING skills skilled at switching between two systems of speech, writing and structure
- Improves MEMORY language rules and vocabulary strengthen mental "muscles"
- Increases PERCEPTION adept at focusing on relevant information
- Increases DECISION-MAKING skills make more rational decisions
- Improves LANGUAGE awareness language structures allows for an more effective communicator, sharper editor and writer, and develops better ear for listening

KDLP at PRCS

- Program starts in Kindergarten (6 year commitment)
- Currently have one class in every grade (K-5)
- One teacher per grade
- Instruction and class work take place in two languages, with Korean used about 50% of the student's instructional day.
- Ideally, a class is comprised of 50% Korean speaking students and 50% English speaking students.
- Each student at each grade level will be taught a cultural talent or skill that will be "showcased" during the year.
- We have a cohesive, schoolwide vision that truly embraces the program as one special component of our campus.
- Celebrate Korean
 Thanksgiving and Lunar New
 Year. Students are also
 introduced to Korean art,
 Taekwondo, Dance and Drum lessons.

The program is not only for children of Korean descent.

- After-school language support Students in each grade are offered free "Korean" homework help once a week to complete their homework assignments, study for tests and/or engage in small group intervention
 - Assistance will primarily be for students with no "korean" help at home
- Network with other DLP parents
- Attend cultural events together or participate in Korean after-school enrichment classes

Parent Commitment

- Learning a second language is no easy task...
- Parents also need to make a commitment to support their child through the program
 - Assist in providing additional resources and support as needed
 - Be patient and encourage your child when they may get frustrated
 - Communicate with the teacher if there are issue or concerns
 - Provide your child extra time afterschool to work through their Korean homework – don't over pack their schedules



KDLP and Kindergarten Readiness

- Did your child attend preschool regularly?
 - Can your child express his/her needs and wants verbally?
 - Can your child take care of general dressing needs?
 - Can your child regulate his/her bathroom and cleaning needs?
 - Can your child separate from you without becoming overly upset?
 - Can your child play, share, and interact with other children?
 - Can your child follow directions and attend to tasks that are lead by an adult for 10 minutes at a time (e.g., circle-time)?
 - Can your child write his/her name?
- Is your child proficient in one language in Korean and/or English?
- Kindergarten Entrance Interviews please sign-up!

KDLP Biliteracy Award

- Students have have an opportunity to receive an award from the district that shows he/she is biliterate by 5th grade when the meet the following requirements:
 - Read 10 grade level books
 - Receive a grade of a 3 or a 4 on an essay written in Korean that answers a prompt about biliteracy in the community.
 - Score benchmark on a reading test in English
- Students receive a certificate and a medal by the district recognizing their biliteracy and it will be recorded in their transcript.
- Students who complete the requirements again in 8th grade and 12th grade will receive a seal on their high school diplomas.

DRESS CODE POLICY

Dress for Success at PRCS!

At Porter Ranch Community School we believe that students should focus on school work and not what to wear to school. It is this reason we adopted a dress code which will be required **every day**.

The following is our Dress Code:

- Navy, royal blue or white collared shirts and PRCS spirit wear for tops and navy, black, and khaki pants, blue or black jeans, shorts, skirts and skorts for bottoms.
- No holes in jeans/pants
- No athletic shorts or pants with logo
- No sweat pants.
- Leggings are allowed only when a skirt is worn.
- No short shorts, short skirts or short skorts allowed. They must be "fingertip" in length.
- Shoes must be closed toed and students can run and play in them safely.
- There are no low cut tops or spaghetti strapped tops.
- No baggy pants or low hanging pants.
- Student's underwear should not be visible and clothing should not be suggestive.
- Excessive jewelry can be dangerous and should not be worn.
- Hats can only be worn outside in the sun and cannot be backwards. Hats may not have inappropriate logos on them.
- No irregular hair colors and styles.

Students are allowed to wear sun-protective clothing, including hats, for outdoor use during the school day only on the yard.

How are students selected?

Selection preferences for applicants will be applied in the following order:

- 1. Siblings living within the school's attendance boundary
- 2. Students living within the school's attendance boundary
- 3. Siblings living within L.A. Unified boundaries
- 4. Students residing within L.A. Unified boundaries
- 5. Siblings requiring an Inter-District Permit
- 6. Students requiring an Inter-District Permit



Dual Language Education Programs Information

If there are more qualified applicants than spaces available at the school, a random, unbiased selection process will be conducted. Siblings of current students in the dual language program have priority for attendance. There is no priority point accrual process for Dual Language Education programs. If there are more applicants than spaces available for a given grade, students will be placed on a waiting list.

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- The waiting list number is not disclosed.
- Students will remain on the waiting list for their first choice with an on-time application even if offered a seat at another program with a late application.
- Schools will notify parents of students who applied with an on-time or with a late application who are on the wait list, when a space becomes available. No further action is necessary for parents of students on the on-time or late waiting list.


