Principal Demirjie's Message: Good Evening PRCS Families. This is Principal Avak Demirjie with few announcements.

This past week, we have been diligently working hard to keep our staff and students safe by identifying all the positive cases, close contact and continued COVID Testing.

Just a reminder, we do not have school on Monday, January 17th in observance of Martin Luther King, Jr. In-person instruction will resume on Tuesday, January 18th with a normal early day schedule.

Please read the following UPDTAED guidelines for our COVID-19 management procedures.

Positive Cases

All students who test positive for COVID-19 must isolate at home for at least 5 days. Individuals who test positive may be released from isolation on Day 6, provided all symptoms are improving, they are feverfree for the past 24 hours without fever-reducing medication, and they have a negative (antigen) test result from a test taken on or after Day 5. Individuals should test with an antigen test on or after Day 5, as PCR tests can stay positive even after an individual is no longer infectious. If an individual does not test on or after Day 5, or if the test result taken on or after Day 5 is still positive, the individual should continue to isolate at home for the full 10 days.

In order to return to campus from a positive case, a student must:

- Isolate for a full 10 days
- To shorten the isolation period:
 - Antigen/home test on Day 5
 - o If negative on Day 5- upload picture of test to Daily Pass for approval (include name, date of birth and date of test)
 - Call Community Engagement 213-725-5637
 - If positive on Day 5 stay home for another 5 days to complete the 10-day quarantine cycle

As a school, we cannot clear positive cases. Families must go through Community Engagement to close or resolve the positive case. To clear a positive case, an antigen (home test) must be administered. ANTIGEN TESTS MUST BE UPLOADED TO THE DAILY PASS AND MUST BE CLEARED BY COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT BEFORE THE STUDENT CAN RETURN TO CAMPUS. Please contact Community Engagement at 213-725-5637. For information on how to upload an external test result, please visit achieve.lausd.net/dailypass.

To pick up an antigen test for Day 5 for students who test positive, visit a dedicated LAUSD "Isolation Testing Site for Return to School/Work," or use an at-home antigen test. These sites can be found at https://achieve.lausd.net/covidtestingappt. Rapid tests will only be distributed to students with a recent positive test result; exposed household members of positive students may make an appointment at a regular LAUSD testing site if they wish to test. Appointments are not required to pick up a test. Antigen test results must be uploaded into the Daily Pass.

Modified Quarantine for TK-12 Students and Non-Boosted Employees ("Test to Stay")

Modified quarantine allows asymptomatic TK-12 students who were exposed to a person with diagnosed COVID-19 in any school setting where students are supervised by school staff (indoors, outdoors, or on a school buses) to continue in-person academic activities that are part of the regular school curriculum and provided during school hours.

Modified Quarantine

- Individuals participating in modified quarantine are permitted to remain at school for the duration of the modified quarantine period. Individuals must be tested once per week for the duration of the quarantine period ("Test to Stay"). Tests can be either a rapid antigen test or a PCR test. The test should ideally be on or around Day 5, so that the student can be released from quarantine on Day 6 if they test negative. If day 5 falls on a weekend, testing will be completed the following week. LAUSD is responsible for testing your child on our campus.
- Individuals participating in modified quarantine will not be required to quarantine at home. They
 will continue attending school. However, students in modified quarantine are not permitted to
 participate in extracurricular activities, including sports, clubs, Beyond the Bell, and other before
 and after school care or programming such as JAXX and YMCA. Please monitor for symptoms.
 Individuals must wear a surgical grade mask while on campus until testing negative after the 5th
 day.

Exemptions from Quarantine

The following individuals are not required to quarantine, provided they are asymptomatic:

- Fully vaccinated employees who are eligible for and have received a booster;
- Fully vaccinated employees who are not yet eligible for a booster;
- Fully vaccinated students (with or without a booster);
- Students and employees who have recovered from laboratory-confirmed COVID- 19 within the last 90 days (exempt from quarantine and testing).

What is A Close

A close contact is someone who has been within six feet of a COVID-19 positive person for more than 15 minutes over a 24-hour period

A close contact is also someone who had unprotected contact with body fluids and/or secretions from someone with COVID-19


All close contacts should monitor for symptoms for 10 days after exposure and test (refer to the Los Angeles Umified Bolstion Protocols If symptoms develop-or if a follow up test is positive)

Note: An individual is not necessarily a close contact because they share a classroom or participate in group activities with the identified positive case.

Who Qualifies for an Exemption?

Who is Eligible for a Booster Shot?

- If the individual received a J&J vaccine, they are booster eligible 2 months after their initial dose If the individual received a Pfizer or Moderna vaccine, they are booster eligible 5 months after their second dose
- Booster shots are available at all Los Angeles Unified vaccination sites
- Individuals are encouraged to upload their booster record in Daily Pass as soon as possible

What Does Modified Quarantine Look Like?

- The individual can continu to work or learn in-person but **not** participate in any before or after school
- The individual is tested around initial close to day 5" after the close contact
 - The individual wears a well-fitting, non-cloth mask at all times except when eating or drinking and must social distance during meals for 10 days.
- If they are asymptomatic and test negative the individual is released from modified quarantine on day 6 and can resume








Now offered to 7" and 8° Grade Students The PSAT 8/9 will be offered to students currently enrolled in 7th and 8th grade. PSAT 8/9 is offered to students that are interested in getting a baseline prior to the PSAT NSMQT in high school. PSAT 8/9 is an optional test. Students that register will be taking the exam during class time on Wednesday, January 26th. Students will be excused from class during testing hours. PSAT 8/9 takes 3 - 4 hours total.




COVID SAFETY: Please have a conversation with your child/ren about the safety of wearing a mask properly. Students may remove their mask during nutrition and lunch while at the table to eat or drink. Covid-19 Testing will continue with the LAUSD Mobile Unit on campus weekly on Mondays and Tuesdays. If you would like to have your child Covid-19 tested on campus, students will need a Covid-19 Testing Consent. Parents can give consent on the Dailypass (see instruction) or to print, Click HERE for Consent Form. Once the Covid-19 test consent is given, the school site is responsible for testing students. If you are having your child/ren tested at an outside testing agency, test results must be uploaded to dailypass.lausd.net weekly to keep Dailypass current to be on campus. This week, LAUSD Testing Unit will not be on campus. If you would like to test your child for COVID, Northridge Middle School and West Valley Occupational Center will be open on Tuesday, September 7th, from 9 am to 7 pm. On campus testing will resume September 13th and 14th.

The COVID-19 School Report Card dashboard provides daily updates on the reopening status and COVID-19 testing results for the staff and students participating in-person instruction on our campus. The page will ask for your name and email. Once you register an email will be sent to you where you will be asked to establish a password. This account is solely for your use.
